Dear Parishioners,




remain connected to the vine to thrive. As we nurture our faith, we can experience joy and growth, similar to how gardens need care to flourish.

## Northern Ireland Day of Reflection Service

On Sunday 21st June at 11.00 am St Macartin's Cathedral will host a service to mark the annual Day of Reflection, remembering those whose lives were given and taken away in the Northern Ireland Troubles, and meditating on the experiences of loss and grief and pain that our society has known in the past decades of violence. The service will provide an opportunity, through a litany of lament, special choral music, and the invitation to contribute a written prayer to hang on the trees of hope, for people to find the solace of God in their pain and to make meaning of their memories.



Lament is an ancient spiritual practice of God's people when passing through seasons of pain: we bring to God our suffering and offer it up to God's throne, waiting for the peace and power found in the presence of the God who knows all our sufferings and consoles us with grace and love. All are welcome at this service.



## Northern Ireland Day of Reflection

### How It Is Observed

The Day of Private Reflection is not marked by public ceremonies or official events. Instead, it is intended to be a personal and introspective experience. People are encouraged to reflect in their own way, whether through:

- Quiet contemplation or meditation
- Visiting places of personal or historical significance
- Reading or listening to stories from the past
- Engaging in conversations about peace and reconciliation

Some organizations may host small, inclusive gatherings or provide resources to support reflection, but the emphasis remains on individual choice and privacy.

### Significance in Northern Ireland

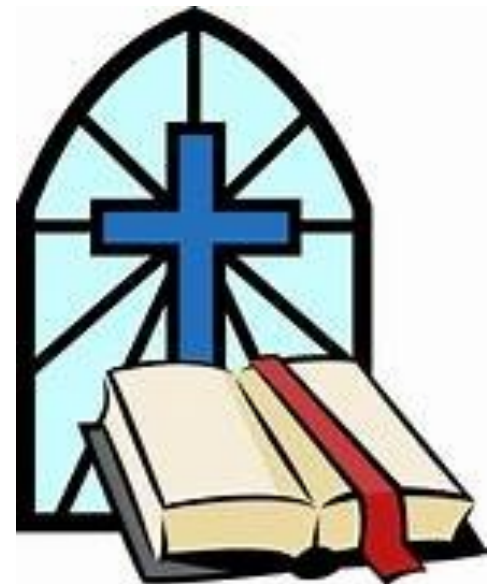
In a society still healing from the divisions of the past, the Day of Private Reflection plays a vital role in fostering mutual understanding and respect. It provides a space for people of all backgrounds to acknowledge the shared history of conflict and to consider how they can contribute to a more peaceful and inclusive future.

## FTD Brothers bring Marathon effort to Northern Ireland



Two brothers who made headlines across the UK for running the London and Belfast Marathons – one with a fridge strapped to his back – arrived in Enniskillen on 7th May. The Dean gave them a donation towards their fund raiser. Jordan and Cian Adams, known as the FTD Brothers, took on the marathons in memory of their mother Geraldine, who died at

the age of 52 after being diagnosed with frontotemporal dementia (FTD).

Sadly, both Jordan and Cian carry the gene that leads to FTD, meaning they too will develop the same type of early onset dementia.

Following their marathon efforts in England, the siblings, from Redditch in Worcestershire, crossed the Irish Sea to take on a fresh challenge of 33 marathons in 33 days. Their efforts will take them to every county on the island of Ireland, including the Longford and Leitrim areas where their mother's family is from, and Fermanagh. On the way, they're raising funds for the Alzheimer's Society Ireland and their own non-profit, the FTD Brothers Foundation.

Over £1,000,000 has been raised in memory of their mother, along with 12 other Irish relatives they have lost to the disease.

"Good luck to Jordan and Cian - they are a true inspiration to us all."

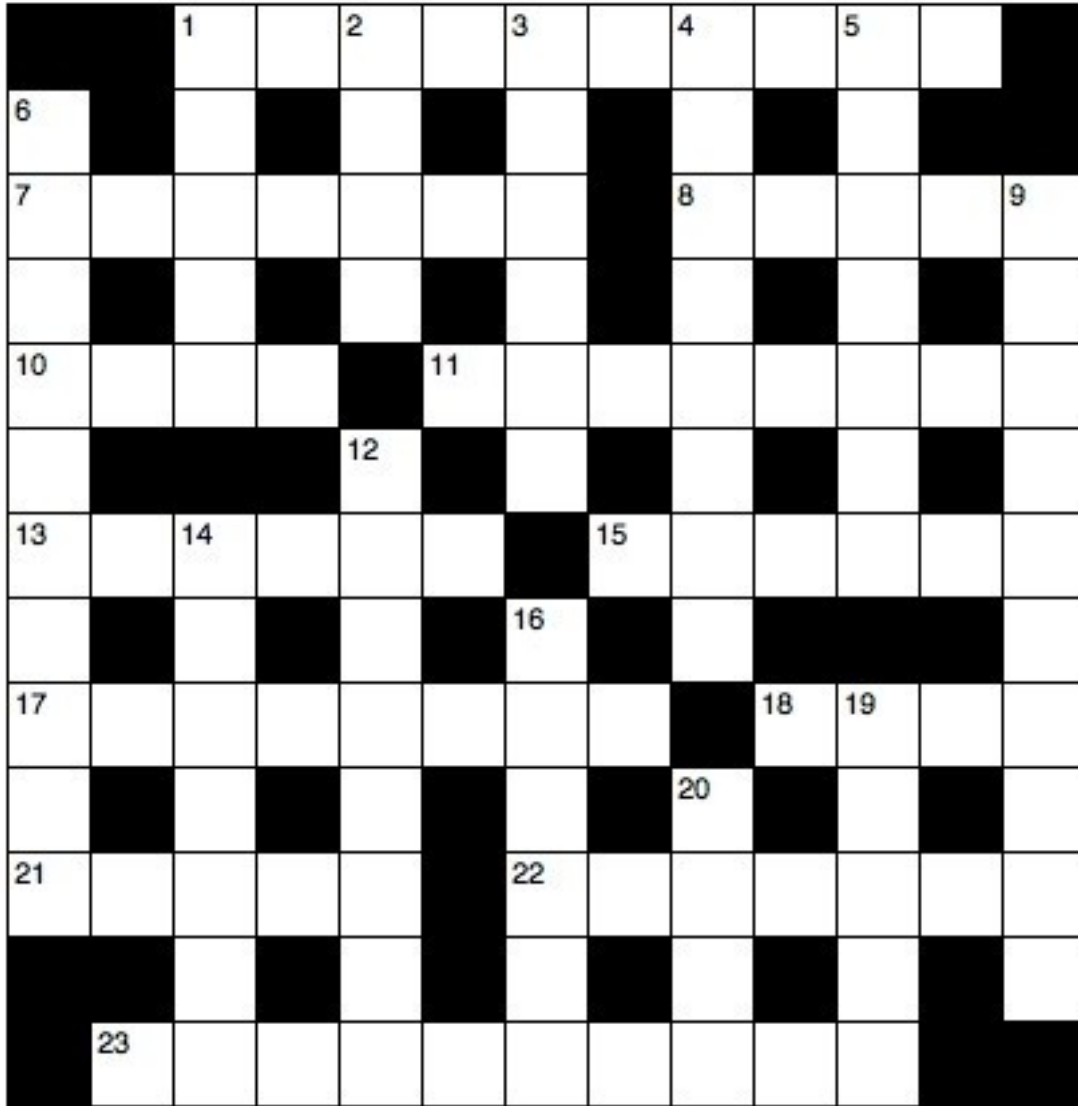
## Hillsborough Castle Garden Party - 20th May 2026

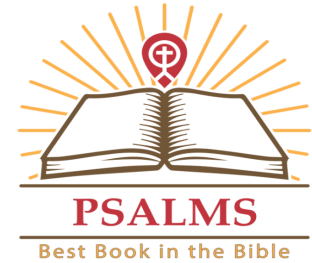

## Psalm

**Psalm 18** speaks to us in troubled times. It is a song of thanksgiving by David in praise of the Lord who protected him from his enemies including the powerful Saul and for God's faithfulness in travelling with him through times of adversity. The psalm is also a

testament to David's faithfulness, keeping the flame of faith alight in the midst of darkness. The psalm's imagery is vivid and immersive. David tells of how 'the cords of death entangled me' and 'the torrents of destruction overwhelmed me' yet God is a 'refuge' and a 'stronghold' (verse 4). God as a sure foundation reminds us of psalm 121

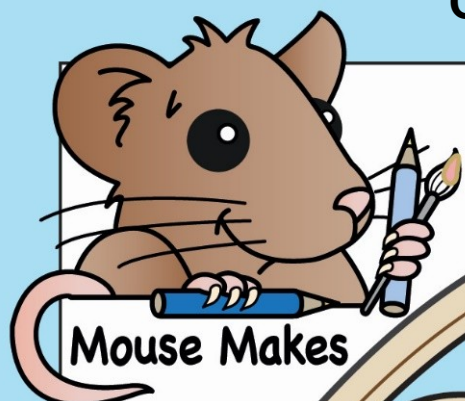
verse 1 where the psalmist lifts his eyes to the hills and finds God's strength and psalm 32 verse 6 where God rescues people from mighty waters. Here we can set psalm 18 into a wider context and see the psalmist's ongoing relationship with God running through the psalms, of the psalmist's faithfulness, strained at times with doubts and uncertainty, and of God's faithful reply. It reminds us to think on the times when God has drawn near to us in seasons of distress and how no matter the storm God's refuge is always there to welcome us and give us shelter.
