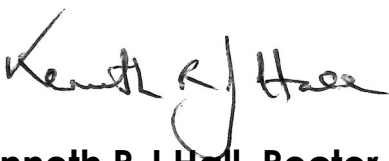
coming together in worship and community. It reminds us that our gatherings enrich our spiritual lives, allowing us to share in the joys and challenges that life presents.

The service was led by the Dean of Clogher, the Very Rev Kenneth Hall and the preacher was the Archdeacon of Clogher, the Venerable Paul Thompson. The lessons were read by Ms Joyce Clingan, Diocesan Secretary; Mrs Adele Moore, Parish Reader and Rev Dr Edwin Aiken.

The music was led by organist, Mr Glenn Moore and the Cathedral Choir. Following Holy Communion, the blessing was given by the Bishop of Clogher, the Right Revd Dr Ian Ellis.

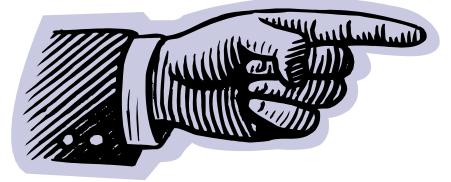

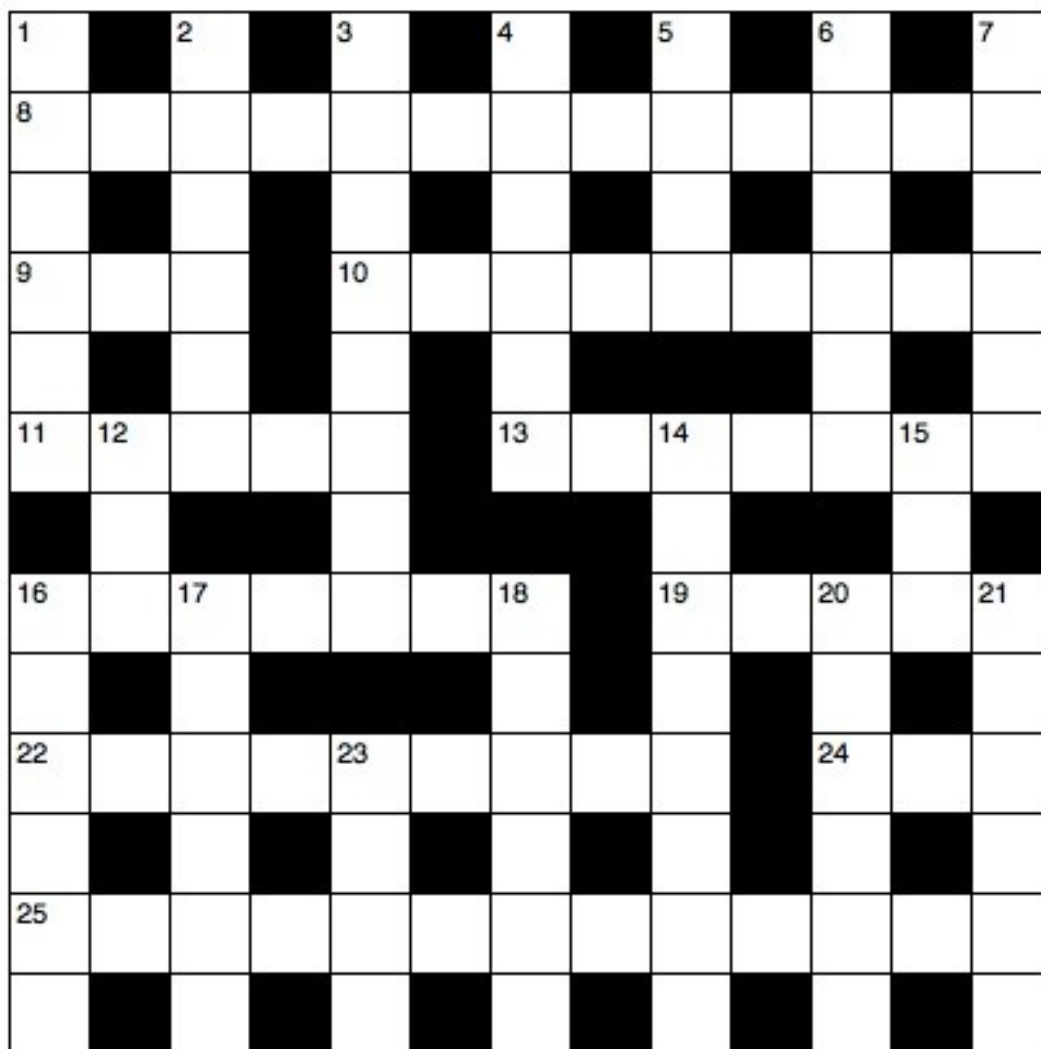

MU 150th Anniversary Service in St Paul's Cathedral

150 years on, Mothers' Union is a "powerhouse" – Archbishop of Canterbury

The Archbishop of Canterbury (The Most Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally) preached at the Mothers' Union 150th Anniversary service at St Paul's Cathedral in London. Addressing over 1,500 members, she praised the global charity as a "powerhouse" and described their grass-roots community support as "salt and light" in the world:

The Archbishop of Canterbury said she had seen first-hand the "profound impact" of its work in communities around the world, "in family life, healthcare, education, social projects — challenging poverty, injustice and violence. . . In fact, I often say, if I need something doing, ask the Mothers' Union to do it." Her sermon on Ephesians had asked: "How do we sustain ourselves as we serve? How do we nourish our own spiritual, mental, and physical well-being, whilst we are tending to the needs of others?"

The answer, she suggested, lay in St Paul's words: "I pray that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

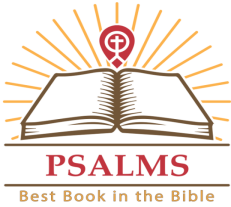
She continued, "may *you* know the depth of God's love in the grass-roots work that you do throughout the world. May *you* know the breadth of God's love as you strive to serve this global movement.

You are salt to our world, in the ordinary, everyday ways you make such a difference to the people you serve, and in the fellowship that you offer to one another."

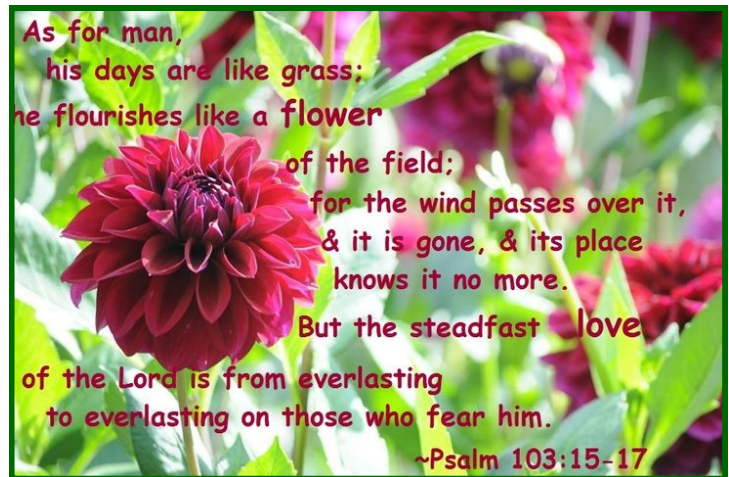


Psalm



Psalm 103 is a psalm of praise, of marvelling at God's mercy, and of his immeasurable love and forgiveness towards all people. It contains the verse telling how with God's love 'your youth is renewed like the eagle's' (verse

5). This image worth exploring. Initially it simply seems to be celebrating a return to the beauty and strength of youthful years. However, in the wider context of the psalm where we are told 'the lives of mortals are like grass... the wind blows over it and it is gone' (verses 15-16) the restoration of youth is perhaps a short-lived mercy, and instead what God offers us is in fact far richer and more potent. In his book 'Falling Upward' Richard Rohr explores the idea that to mature spiritually we must rebuild from the ashes of our failures; from the shattered dreams, fractured relationships, regrets and failures of our youth, whatever they may be. In confronting these shortcomings in the second half of life and journeying inwardly with God, we spiritually mature to rise anew with the vigour and wonder of youth—but this time with forgiveness for ourselves and for others, with wisdom, humility and compassion in our wings. God's grace is that he can renew us at any age to soar and live as we are meant to—joyously, richly, generously, in the fullness of life.

Sunday Lights and Café, at which we use interactive and creative forms of learning to help the children learn about the Christian faith (telling Bible stories, discussion, songs, games, and crafts), will return in the Sundays following "Back to Church Sunday". Registration forms will be available, and should be completed, following the "Back to Church Sunday" service. From Sunday 4th October onwards, the children will leave during the 11.00am service after the singing of a

family hymn for their own activities, and will attend and take part in monthly Family Services. The first Family Service of the new programme (after "Back to Church Sunday") will be held on 25th October. Sunday Lights is open to anyone in P1-4, and Sunday Lights Café welcomes children in P5-Year 8.

Confirmation

A Confirmation Service will be held during Eastertide 2027 for young people of Year 9 and above. Those who expect to be confirmed should regularly attend services with their families. Confirmation is about taking your place within the life and mission of the Church. Application forms for Confirmation are available in the Parish Office for those who wish to be confirmed. Please collect and return them as soon as possible. Details of Confirmation Classes will be released in due course.

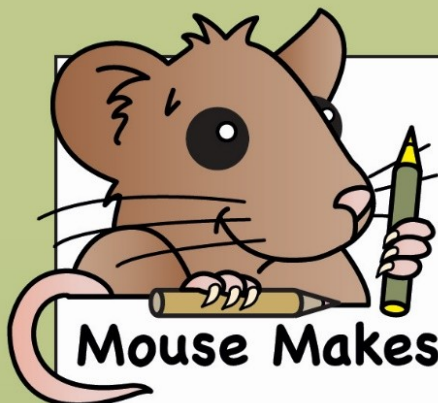

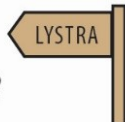

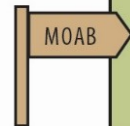
